Example 1: UNICEF Executive Leadership Development Programme



- The program was run at INSEAD in groups of 40 participants (total of some 200+ people over 5 years)
- Focus on high potentials: develop leadership/managerial talent (e.g. to take on country rep positions)
- Develop capability to work with multiple stakeholders (government, other humanitarian organizations, private business, etc.)
- Help make the transition to supporting government instead of executing themselves
- Sandwich program with two modules on campus and individual project in-between
- Individual coaching by INSEAD faculty
- Mix of UNICEF and INSEAD faculty from multiple disciplines
- Mix of teaching (mornings) and group work/discussions (afternoons)

Harnessing and aligning global stakeholders

- There are a large number of stakeholders working in public health supply chain with little or no coordination, working in silos, leading to significant inefficiencies and waste of resources. In order to realize the potential for synergy of these stakeholders, Gates Foundation and Global Fund are funding the Africa and Asia Resource Centres
- The objectives of the 'ARCs' are to coordinate among all stakeholders and programs; build and share a knowledge repository; catalyze cross-fertilization and learning in the countries; and among the ARCs
- The Asia ARC countries in Phase 1 will include India, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Bangladesh, and one more (country priorities are not fixed)
- The ARCs will benefit any stakeholder working in procurement and supply chain in the target countries



Piloting and Scaling



Focus areas: Accelerating & transforming pilots into sustainable projects

The world is littered with ideas and pilots struggling to reach scale. We have been conducting research and catalyzing scale-up and sustainability for over a decade. Jointly the partnership brings the collective strengths of 8 Centres of Excellence:

- We are in discussions with and supporting several UN agencies, IFRC (Red Cross), the largest humanitarian organization and hundreds of startups
- We organize start-up bootcamps, entrepreneurship projects, work with inside/with our incubators and accelerators
- INSEAD scholars, faculty and advisors, and 300 + global alumni provide support to help scale ideas

Multi-sectoral Partnerships and Engaging the Private Sector



Focus areas: Multi-sector Partnerships and Engaging the Private Sector

Conducted 20 years of research on the evolution, benefits, risks, challenges, and determinants of success and failure in multi-sectoral partnerships This is one of the most under-leveraged areas; although there is interest from the public and private sectors to engage with each other, there is limited research and experience on how. We can support by:

- Exploring working models in private sector that can be applied for promoting public health and humanitarian goals
- Conducting scalable pilots with the private sector to create a shared vision and a sustainable model
- Incubating and accelerating socially impactful business models that are self sustainable (e.g. our work with Red Cross)
- Examples: TNT/ WFP "Moving the World" partnership, North Star Alliance, Agility, Tulipe, and Medicines for Malaria Venture

Due to lack of training and capacity, countries tend not to adopt or implement new policies, or change suppliers. Our areas of work:

- Conducting TNA (training needs assessment) at scale and low cost, supported by continuous learning and technical assistance, leveraging technology and personal interaction
- Developing the right competencies, organizational structures, and culture to swiftly and adequately respond to the many uncertainties humanitarian/ public health actors are subject to
- Free tools, jointly developed between Empower/INSEAD, PtD/ UNICEF and UNDP, including Competency Assessment Tool for PSM, Fundamentals of PSM in Global Health PSM course
